Traveling in Foreign Countries

The term "foreign countries" however is used symbolically in modern day speculative Masonry, and is not meant to refer to a certain geographical location or actual country. Freemasonry in and of itself is a foreign country to those not initiated into its rites. To fully appreciate and enjoy the privileges of the Craft, the new initiate must become familiar with the territory of Freemasonry by learning its language, customs, and history. Once raised, all Freemasons must continue their journey into the depths of the Craft, and continue to search for Light and truth wherever it may be found.

The term "foreign countries" may also be a metaphor for the spiritual worlds. The ancients concerned themselves with vast spiritual worlds, and their method of gaining admission through various spiritual spheres was through secret passwords, grips, signs, and sometimes angelic names, and holy words.
