



A big thanks to all those who have helped with the snow and ice removal, especially Wor. Bro. Wendell Shallenberger for his tractor work. Thank You!




Famous Freemasons: Arnold D. Palmer

Arnold Daniel Palmer was born September 10th, 1929 in Latrobe, Pennsylvania. His father Milfred, in addition to being a Deacon of his church, was also the local Golf pro, and started teaching Arnold the game at age Three. During his childhood, he enjoyed playing with his father and became quite skilled at the game, but had other aspirations and dreamed of being a pilot. After High School he enrolled at Wake Forest College, but dropped out his Senior Year when his best friend and roommate was killed in a car accident. He received some pilot training during his military service, but due to budget cutbacks left the Coast Guard in 1954 and took up golfing again. Within a year, he qualified for the PGA Tour and less than a year later won his first tournament, the 1955 Canadian Open. Palmer was named Athlete of the Decade by the Associated press for the 1960's, and over the next 30+ years would claim ninety-two championships before retiring in 1994. He was credited with bringing the game of golf into the public mainstream and making it popular outside of country clubs. During his career, he also built quite a business and financial empire through endorsements and other golf-related ventures – including co-founding the Golf Channel. He continues flying when he can, including piloting his own private Citation X.

Brother Palmer is a member of Loyalhanna Lodge #275 in Latrobe, PA, and is also active in the Scottish Rite Valley of Pittsburgh where he received the 33^o in 1998.
